How did Peter use the keys? Acts 2:38 "...in the name of Jesus Christ..." (Opening the kingdom to the Jews) 8:16 "...in the name of the Lord Jesus" (Now, to the Gentiles) 10:48 "...in the name of the Lord" (Now, to the Samaritans) **19:5** "...in the name of the Lord Jesus" (re-baptized upon further understanding) I Cor. 1:13 "Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for vou? Or were vou baptized in the name of Paul?" (No! You are baptized in the name of the one crucified for you.) **Col. 3:17** "And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, [do] all in the name of the Lord Jesus" (Father? Son? Holy Ghost?) Col. 2:9 "For in him [Jesus] dwelleth all the fullness of the Godhead bodily."

The name (singular) of the three offices of God (Father, Son, and Holy Ghost) is the Lord Jesus Christ. When the church divided God into three persons (Trinity) this truth was lost.

Ephesians 3:14 "For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, **15** Of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named,"

Deut. 6:4 / Mk 12:29, 32 / Gal. 3:20 / 1 Tim. 2:5 / James 2:19 / Rev 4:2 / +

Follow the Scriptural pattern and you can expect Scriptural results. "...and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost."

Don't miss this: The form of Baptism performed in most Christian churches is absolutely foreign to the Scriptural pattern. How can this be? Both Scripture and history testify to the truth. Most all churches today follow a literal interpretation of Matthew 28:19: "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:" (It was not always so.)

Yet...on the day of Pentecost, the inauguration of the Christian Church, Peter commanded the people thusly: "...Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost." ACTS 2:38

Now we must ask ourselves: Is Scriptural Baptism to be performed in the name of Father, Son, and Holy Ghost? Or in the name of Jesus Christ?

Or is there really a choice to make? Both commands are in the Bible. Is one right and one wrong? If so, then the Bible is not to be trusted. Or is it possible there is an understanding that the apostles had that the church somehow lost?

Fact: The act of Baptism with wording as literally stated in Matthew 28:19 (Father, Son, and Holy Ghost) is not only unknown to Scripture, but the wording is not even used in the first two hundred years of Christian history.

NAME was an ancient synonym for "person." Payment was always made in the name of some person referring to ownership. Therefore being Baptized in Jesus' name became His personal property. *"And ye are Christ's; and Christ [is] God's."* I COR 3:23 What is the foundation of Christ's church? Is it the doctrine of the apostles and prophets? True. But there is more.

MATTHEW 16:15 "He saith unto them, But whom say ye that I am?

16 And Simon Peter answered and said, Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God.

17 And Jesus answered and said unto him, blessed art thou, Simon Barjona: for flesh and blood hath not revealed [it] unto thee, but my Father which is in heaven.

"Upon this rock I will build my church;" This is the revelation of Christ (the Logos, the living, anointed Word)...in any and every age.

Matthew 16:19 "And I will give unto thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

Luke 17:21 "Neither shall they say, Lo here! or, lo there! For, behold, **the kingdom of God is** within you."

That's the Holy Ghost within those who have received Him.
